
WALK WITH JESUS

Hebrews—Part 1 Jesus is Greater

QUESTION 1:

Over the course of the first seven weeks of this series through Hebrews, what's been most helpful or rewarding to you? What's been most challenging?

QUESTION 2:

This is next question in three parts.

- First, have one person read **Genesis 14:17-20**. This is the story of Melchizedek the only story of Melchizedek in the Old Testament.
- Now, have one person read Psalm 110:4. At the time of Jesus, this
 verse was thought to be a prophetic word about the coming Messiah.
- Finally, go around and read all of Hebrews 7 together, out loud. Each person can take a couple of verses and just keep going around until you've read the entire chapter together.

OK, take a deep breath. That was a lot of Bible reading. Based on everything you've read, what do you think the writer of Hebrews is trying to communicate about who Jesus is and the type of high priest he is in terms of how he connects us to God?

QUESTION 3:

Some people make this distinction between guilt and shame: Guilt is feeling bad about what you do. Shame is feeling bad about who you are. Do you agree or disagree? Why?

QUESTION 4:

Some people confess the same sins again and again. Some are concerned that if they've forgotten a sin from the past, it may be held against them in eternity. How do you think confession of sin actually works? What do you base your understanding on? How does the truth that Christ has paid the price for sin once and for all transform your thinking and life?

OUESTION 5:

Read **John 19:28-30**. What impact does the truth of Jesus' completed work have on your life? How would you describe the significance of the statement "it is finished" to someone who isn't a Christian?
