FOOTSTEPS TO THE CROSS

During my youth and early adulthood, Easter time included two major events. There was the joyous celebration of Easter Sunday for Christ's risen defeat of death. But also, there was the Good Friday observances. Almost all stores and business closed from noon till three when churches had Good Friday services.



Over the past thirty years or so that custom has changed. Good Friday has become just another regular day of work. The time spent in contemplation of the sacrifice Christ made, the pain, agony, and humiliation he went through has been lost.

Footsteps to the Cross has, for me, brought back a time of reflection and thought of all that Christ suffered that day. Going through each of the devotional stations and listening, looking, and taking part of the theme of that station helps bring into focus what Christ had to endure. To sit quietly and think about Christ helps to make one more aware of his journey to the cross.

One year, there was a station with several backpacks filled with rocks, representing the sin Christ took upon himself for us. Lifting one of those heavy backpacks helped me realize the magnitude of the load of sin He lifted from mankind. Another year, there was a cross and we were encouraged to drive a nail into it. It made more intense in one's mind what Christ's last minutes on earth were like.

I would encourage everyone to thoughtfully take the time to visit Footsteps to the Cross.
